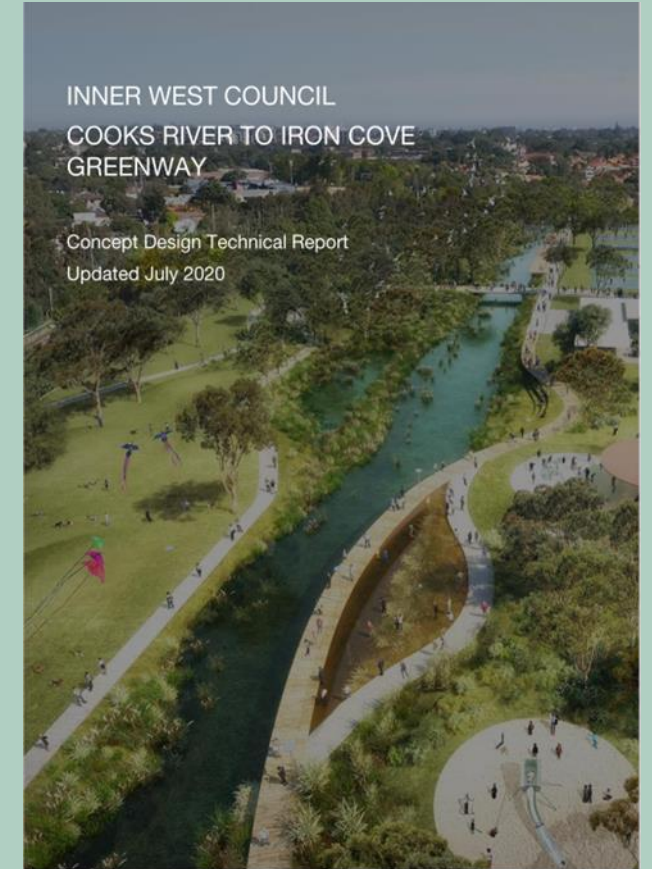
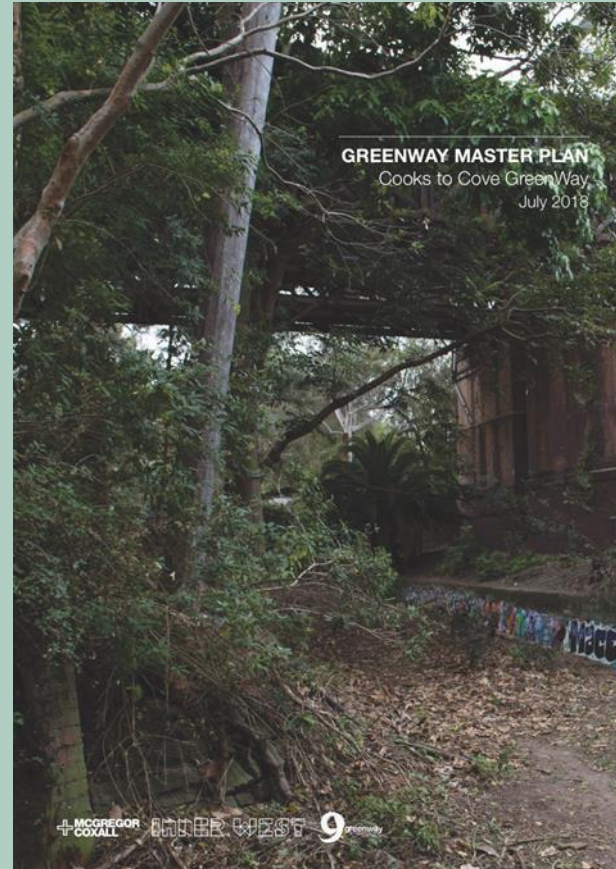

What is the GreenWay

- Delivering on a community vision
- A 5.8km active transport and biodiversity corridor linking the Cooks to Iron Cove.
- It mostly follows the route of the Inner West Light Rail and Hawthorne Canal facilities.

2km of Pedestrian and Cycle Sharepath

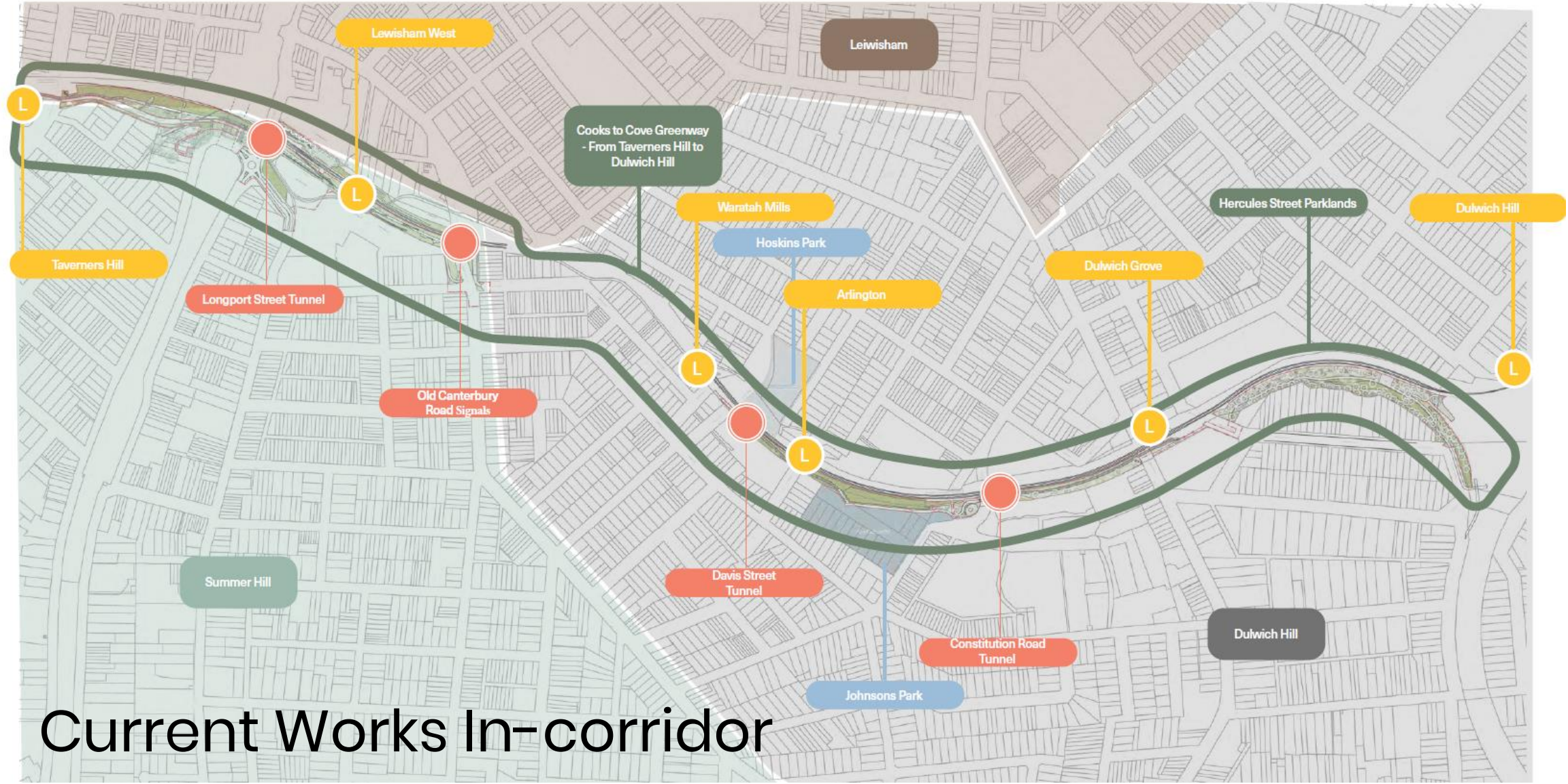
Linking 6 Light Rail Stops

3 New Tunnels

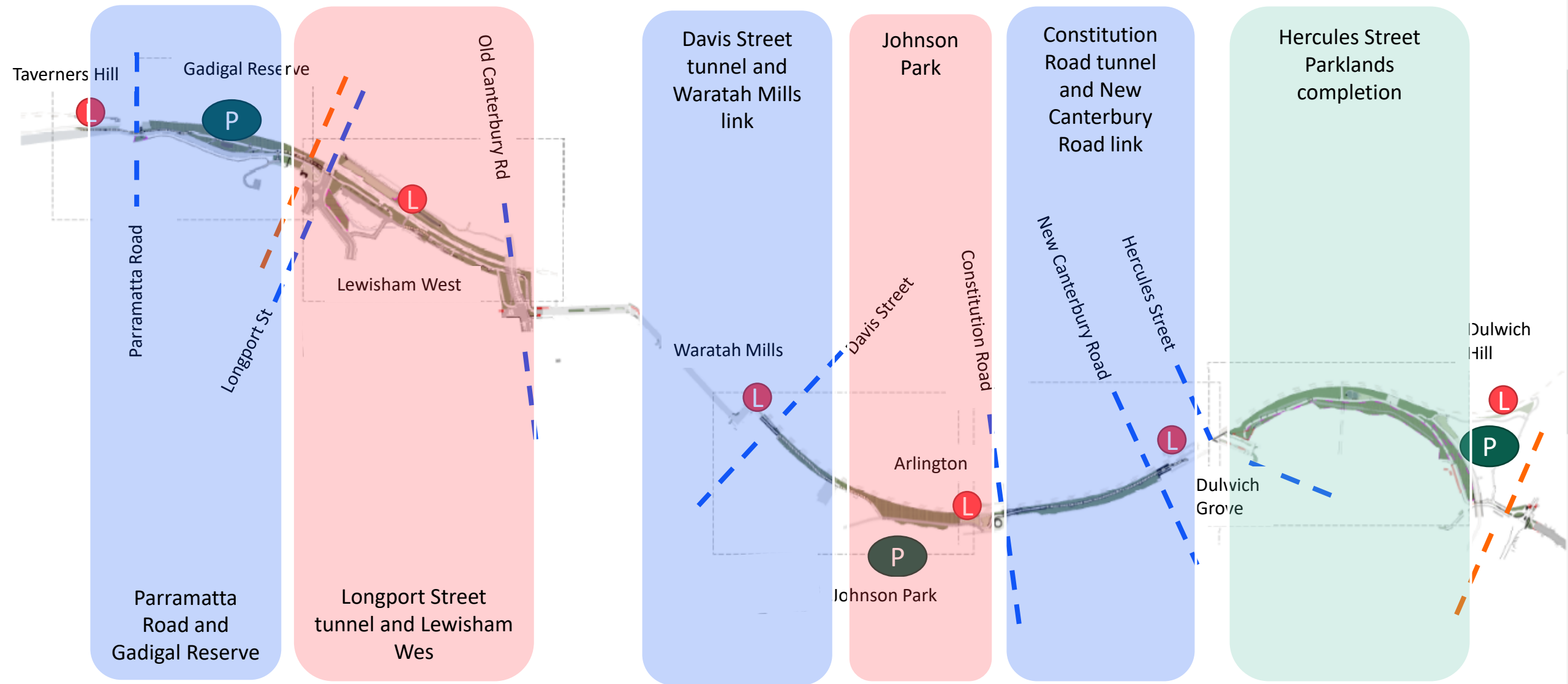

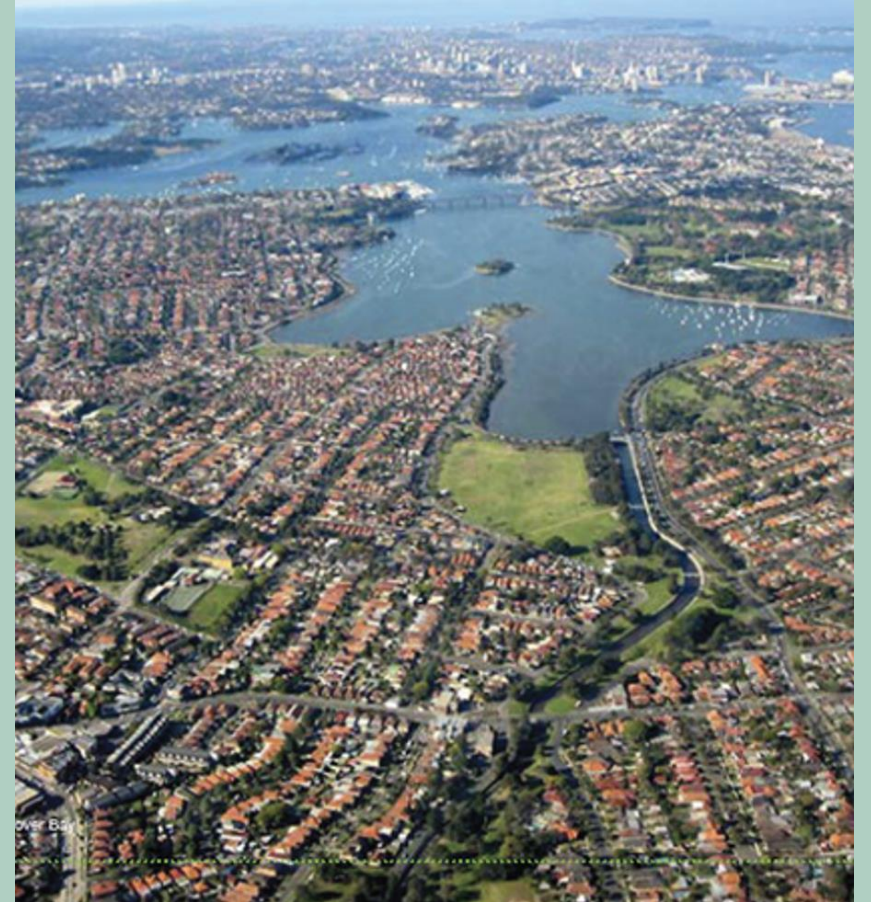
Iron Cove Creek Masterplan

Iron Cove Creek Masterplan - Status

- Initial community engagement sought
- 92 percent community support
- Draft masterplan was developed and publicly exhibited in November 2023
- Being tabled to April Council meeting for endorsement

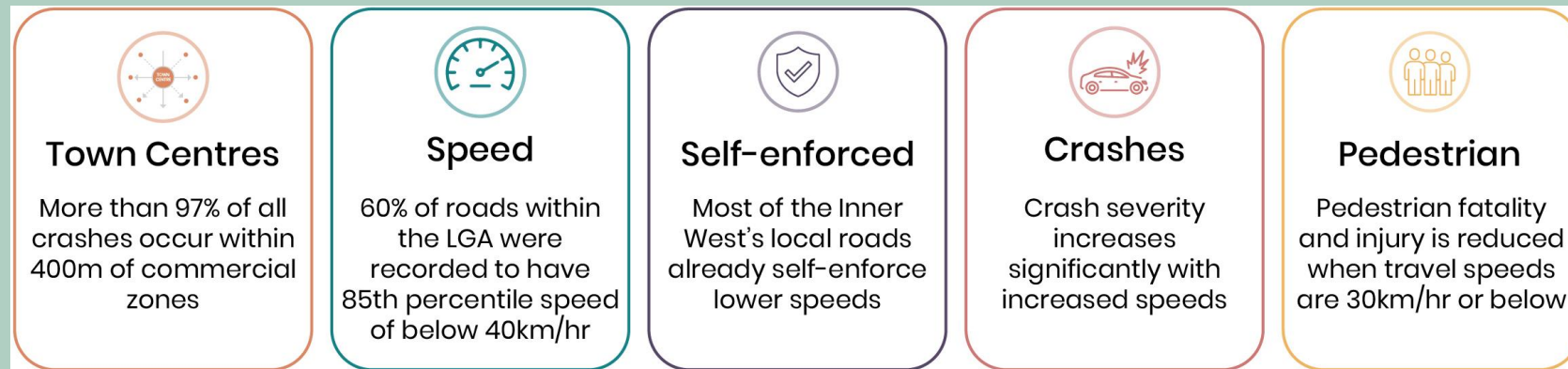

INNER WEST

What is Innerwest@40

- Proposes 40km/h speed limits on all local roads
- Proposes lower and more consistent speeds on regional and state roads



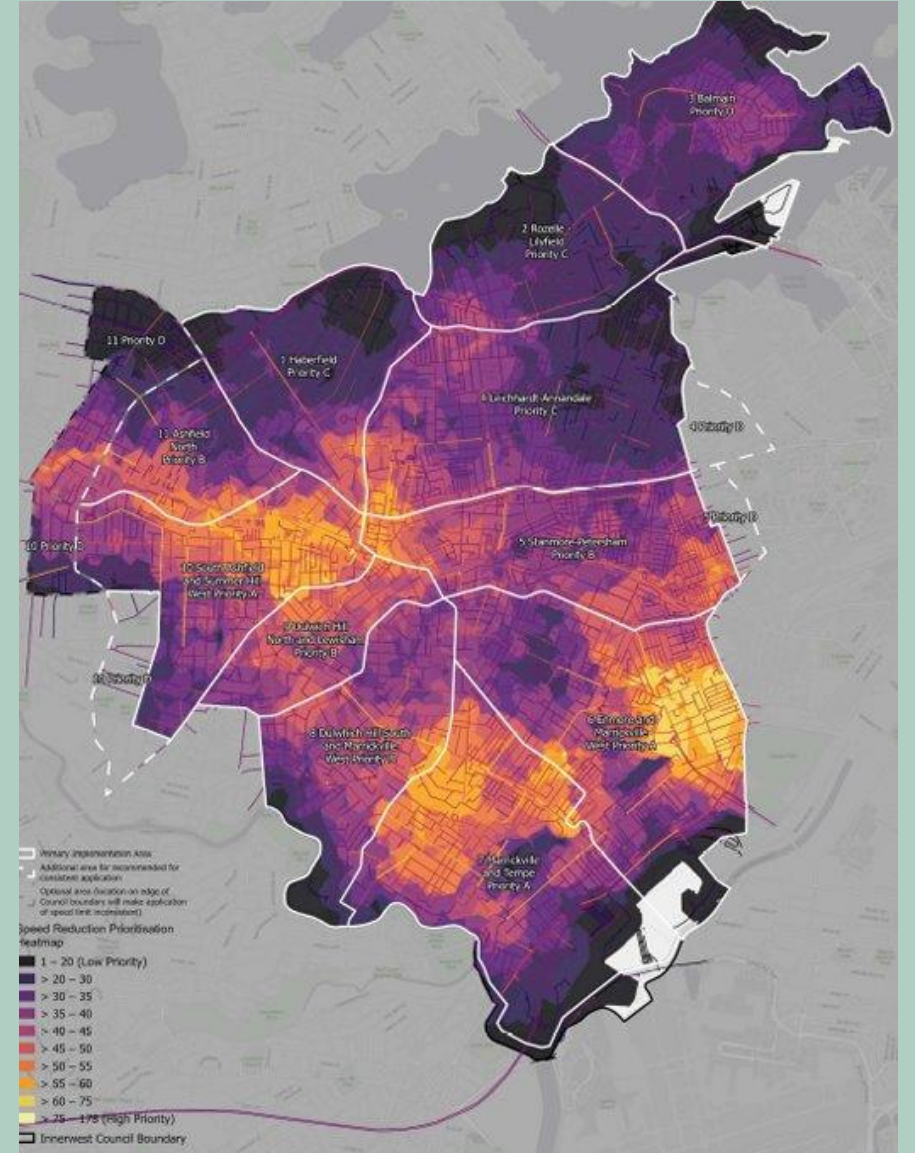
Benefits and impacts

- Average speeds already below 40km/hr in 50km/hr speed zones
- Lowering speed limits from 50 km/h to 40km/h has significant safety benefits
- Minimal impact to overall travel times (under 37 seconds)



Current Status and next steps

- InnerWest@40 received 82% support by the community
- Council will consider InnerWest@40 in March 2024
- Council to submit Inner West@ 40 to TfNSW for approval and funding
- Council to review cases for 30km/h speed limits in selected locations



Aboriginal Survival Memorial in Yeo Park

The first Aboriginal Survival Memorial, in Yeo Park, is nearing completion.

Breathe, by Aboriginal artists Nicole Monks and Maddison Gibbs, will carefully place 243 engraved sandstone boulders to act as portals to ancient stories.



The Memorial in Yeo Park will be dedicated to Reconciliation with Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples.

The launch will occur in late March 2024.
