Cooks to Cove GreenWay

Community Update - February 2020 Construction Commences



The GreenWay is an integrated ecological and active transport corridor that follows the light rail line from the Cooks River to Iron Cove. It facilitates a variety of recreation opportunities and incorporates local places for culture and art.

What's happening now?

In 2019, the community provided feedback on concept designs. We are now using your feedback to develop detailed designs and construction plans.

The GreenWay will be built in a staged approach starting in 2020 and finishing in 2023. These stages are based on the type of works, location, land ownership and approvals required.

Works will commence in Council's parks and along on road sections of the GreenWay first. Due to the complexity of works within the light rail corridor itself, these will take place last to allow more time for planning and design.

Completed Works

Geotechnical and Utility searches

In late 2019 we completed geotechnical investigations and utility searches along the length of the corridor. This information will inform design and construction of the GreenWay.

Blackmore Oval Shared Path and Lighting Upgrade

In late 2019 we completed a short section of the GreenWay between Richard Murden Reserve and the North Leichardt Light Rail Stop. The upgraded path provides a safer route for commuters and park users.

Upcoming Works

Richard Murden Reserve Path and Lighting Upgrade

Upgrade of the shared path through Richard Murden Reserve will commence in March.

The works include the upgrade of 1400m of the existing path to a 3.5m wide shared path between Marion Street and the City West Link. This includes path lighting and

landscaping works and facilitates future upgrades to the Reserve envisioned in the adopted Master Plan.

Works in the park will be undertaken in a staged approach and alternate path routes will be provided for park users throughout the works.

Local residents will be notified prior to commencement of construction.

Works are anticipated to run from March to October.


Lang Road Pedestrian Bridge
