EDGE GreenWay

EDGE GreenWay on the waterfront is a free community celebration of creativity – it's the perfect way to enjoy time with family and friends.

Join a pop-up plane party hosted by *Trolley'd* at a bridge bar showcasing free botanical mocktails and grooves from cockpit DJs Jay Katz (Sounds of Seduction), Nian (Koori Radio) and Kali (FBI and Picnic).

Explore outdoor sculpture trails, *Art on the GreenWay* and *Art on the EDGE*, roving performances and music with the spectacular bay as a backdrop. Hear words of wisdom from Aboriginal elders, environmentalists and foraging weed wizards.

Exciting activities will keep small hands busy with lantern and upcycled-headpiece making. Enjoy performers, puppeteers and a bike-powered dance floor. Bring a blanket, visit a food truck, and settle in for the spectacular twilight premiere of *Water's Edge* by renowned physical-theatre company Legs On The Wall, see our *Boat of Dreams* set sail as the city switches off for *Earth Hour*.

KIDS' PROGRAM

3-7pm

Grab a kids' program *Through the Magnifying Glass* by cartoon artist Bunkwaa, where huge magnifying glasses highlight native species.

With artworks, puppets and performers, kids can explore the native creatures that live here, including the eastern blue-tongue lizard, striped marsh frog, giant dragonfly and long-nosed bandicoot.

Visit the upcycled playground with a bike-powered dance floor by Milkcrate Events and join The Agar Dish in the Regeneration Lab for animation and glassblowing workshops and performances.

Spot the Rockabilly Bandicoot or meet furry and feathered friends including cockatoos, lorikeets, ibis, herons, spoonbills, crows, witchetty grubs, and the Blue Banded Bee, all by The Deep Sea Astronauts.

Make a lantern with Ikara opposite the Waterhole Bar and add your wish to the *Boat of Dreams*.

7pm: Join the sunset GreenWay Lantern Parade.

8pm: Settle on the bridge for the spectacular premiere of *Water's Edge* by Legs on The Wall.

Art on the EDGE

- A Fish Traps** by Jason Wing
References the local Wangal people of the Eora Nation and Iron Cove Bay through indigenous fishing and gathering traditions such as fish traps, spears, knives, shields, and water-carrying vessels.
- B Crank Zappa** by Amigo & Amigo Design
Made of 1,000 plastic bags, straws, 800 salvaged plastic bottles with 1,200m of recycled twine woven by 40 volunteers, this hot-tempered electric jellyfish will zap you if you get too close. Supported by an Inner West Council environment grant.
- C Hidden Worlds, Hidden Treasures** by Graham Chalcraft
Ancient algae species explore diversity through scale, colour and dynamic forms to deliver enriched spaces with a contemporary twist.
- D Species on the Edge** by Felicity Yorston
Highlights the native species often unseen, yet living among us. Come after dusk to glimpse the GreenWay's hidden biodiversity.
- E The Rhythmotron** by Andrew Milne & John Taylor
An interactive robotic drum machine housed in a re-purposed upright piano; you control the rhythms.
- F Behind the Scenes** by John Platt
A photographic installation of candid film-set shots, captured over the past 30 years.

7.40-8pm: Welcome


A gathering of all creatures on the bridge and surrounds. Official welcome with Aboriginal dancers and announcement of the *Inner West Environmental Art Award*.

Welcome *Earth Hour* to the Inner West. Go off-grid with solar light and sound. Didgeridoo and dance will accompany our *Boat of Dreams* across Iron Cove Bay.


