

Marrickville Council's Open Marrickville unlocks the talents and creativity of local communities and celebrates our many and varied cultures.

Open Marrickville is now in its second year, and takes the form of a festival - eleven days celebrating multiculturalism through storytelling, music, dance, art, theatre, food, and simply gathering together.

The festival provides opportunities for deeper cultural understanding and exchange between communities, with a focus on youth involvement, encouraging younger generations to connect with and learn about their individual backgrounds, and share and celebrate these with the broader community.

Open Marrickville is timed to coincide with National Sister Cities Day, and will take place from 20 June to 30 June 2013 in a variety of locations across the Local Government Area. These activities are organised by local community groups, schools and community organisations, with support from Marrickville Council through a grants program.

The local community was invited to apply for funding to stage their own events with the themes of culture, sharing, adventurousness, empowerment and community collectiveness.

The program takes into account that many communities call Marrickville home and gives them the opportunity to be involved and make decisions about how they want to be represented. Council provided support in the form of workshops and assistance, and hopes that this will empower groups to use these skills to hold their own activities in the future.






