PUBLIC ART POLICY

POLICY STATEMENT

The Marrickville Public Art Strategy, through integrated planning and responsive design, will facilitate a distinct and diverse collection of temporary and permanent artworks in public places that illuminate, celebrate and contribute to Marrickville's unique culture by adding value to civic reputation and community image; celebrate urban character and diverse cultural heritage by fostering local cultural identity and pride; create and renew a sense of place in the built and natural environments by contributing to visual quality, ambience and identity; and contribute to the cultural environment by acknowledging community values.
