POLICY STATEMENT

- 1. To manage Council's transport infrastructure to balance safety, efficiency, accessibility, and environmental quality needs;
- 2. To manage traffic facilities;
- 3. To facilitate the use of the various modes of transport.

POLICY STATEMENT

- 1. Council will develop and maintain safe and accessible cycling routes and facilities;
- 2. Council will develop and maintain safe and accessible pedestrian routes, including provision for disabled access;
- 3. Council will establish and service a Local Traffic Committee, known as the Local Traffic Planning and Advisory Committee;
- 4. Council will implement local and regional traffic management schemes on a priority basis throughout the area until such time as the Local Government Area is covered.
- 5. Council will participate in regional transportation planning.
- 6. Design of new or reconstructed roads is to consider reducing travel lane width in order to provide parking, pedestrian and bicycle facilities and improving the aesthetic appeal of the streetscape.

- 7. Time restricted parking applicable to Council owned car parks is to apply equally to residents and non residents.
- 8. Council is opposed to the transport of any toxic waste and/or hazardous chemical throughout the Marrickville Local Government Area.
- 9. Council is opposed to the passage of B-Doubles on roads throughout the Marrickville Local Government Area other than Parramatta Road and the Princes Highway.
