<p>History: In 1913 the Haymarket Company sold this land to William Booth, of London, described on the title deed as "General of the Salvation Army". The original building, described in <i>Sands Directories</i> as Salvation Army Barracks, is believed to have been erected in 1914.</p> <p>Ownership of the barracks was transferred to the Salvation Army (NSW) Property Trust in 1931. The Army finally sold the building in 1964.</p>

<p>Description: The present building is a modest painted brick structure with side buttresses and a pitched roof. To the front a lower bay has been added, the front wall of which contains a window of horizontal format and an entrance doorway above which is a metal hood. Above this there is a projecting wide frieze containing signage, which extends around the side of the building. Further above this there is a stepped parapet sheeted in metal. The front of the building is not parallel with the boundary.</p>			
<p>Modifications: The original building is virtually concealed by the alterations and additions.</p>			

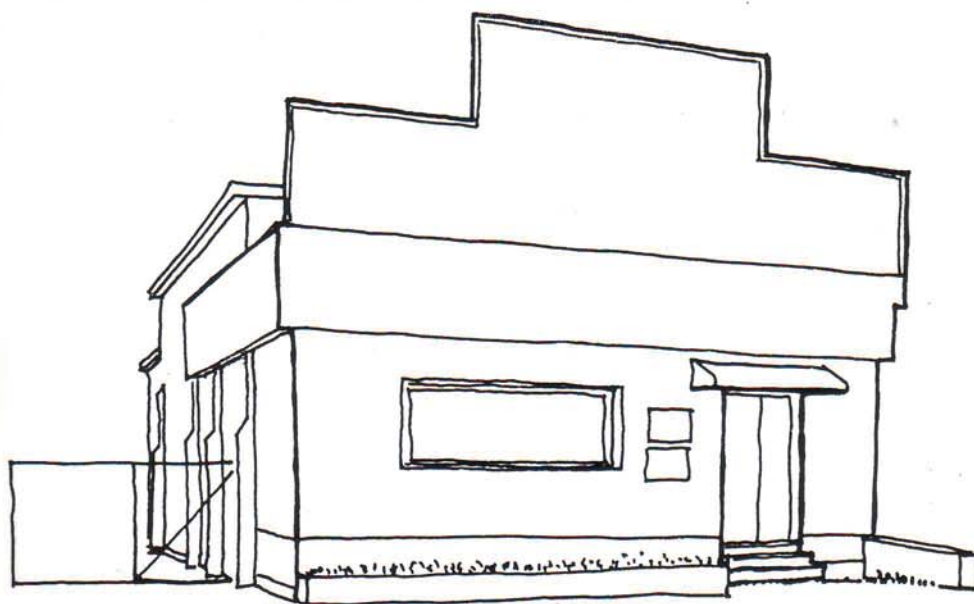
