Last year, 89 Inner West projects received more than \$500,000 in Council funding. This year, \$443,000 is available for your project, initiative or event.

Applications for 2021 grants opens Monday 9 August and closes Friday 3 September, 5pm.

The Annual Grants program has five streams: Arts, History, Wellbeing, Environment and Recreation.

The grants are for projects commencing in February until December 2022.


## Marrickville Library nominated


In early July, Marrickville Library was nominated for the International Public Library of the Year Award 2021.

## Beautiful Dawny now open

Council's heritage restoration of Dawn Fraser Baths is now complete. The Baths are set to reopen as soon as the public health restrictions are lifted.

Council is celebrating the completion of the \$8 million project with a special winter program and free entry for two weeks after the reopening.

Funding for the project included a \$2.2 million grant from the Greater Sydney Sports Facility Fund.



## New community space

Balmain has a new community open space.

The plan to demolish the front of the 1957 Telstra exchange building, improve the presence of the heritage post office and create an open space with seating and shade dates back to 2004.

The design includes a green wall with an artwork by local artist Sue Callanan, 'Connecting You Now', which references the telecommunications history of Balmain.

The heritage post office, in particular the clock tower, can now be more readily seen and enjoyed from areas around the Darling, Rowntree and Montague streets intersection.



## Alex Trevallion Plaza

Council's \$1,250,000 upgrade of Alex Trevallion Plaza is based on a major element of the Marrickville Town Centre Public Domain Master Plan. The final design was completed recently and includes:

- New bluestone and granite paving
- More seating
- Replacing the shelter
- New ramp access and dining platform adjacent to Post Office
- New landscaped garden beds with passive irrigation and replacing trees with native shade trees in the beds
- Upgrading lighting and providing decorative LED lighting
- Installing a totem and signs with historic information
- Relocating bins, meters, drainage pits and pipes

The upgraded Plaza will also feature an artwork that celebrates Marrickville's Greek heritage.

## Tempe Reserve upgrade

The \$6 million Tempe Reserve upgrade includes:

- New synthetic multi-purpose sports field
- New turf for the natural turf sports fields
- Irrigation upgrade to natural turf fields
- Stormwater drainage upgrades including stormwater harvesting to service the amenities block
- Sports field lighting upgrade
- Tree planting

Council has also set aside \$860,000 in this year's budget to refurbish Tempe Reserve Robyn Webster sports centre.

NSW local government elections have been postponed until Saturday 4 December, in response to the COVID-19 situation.



## New park in Croydon

The Inner West has a new pocket park.

Bell Reserve in Croydon was completed in late June.

Betty Bell bequeathed her home 'Balmoral' to the former Ashfield Council with the intention that Council maintain the land as an open space reserve. Council spent \$580,000 on transforming the block to create an inclusive community space that celebrates the site's history, has interactive nature areas for children to play and explore and also a rain garden that will naturally filter storm water.

Bell Reserve is located at 188 Croydon Road, Croydon.



## Little Greece

Marrickville Road between Livingstone Road and Victoria Road will soon be 'Little Greece'.

The Geographic Names Board is expected to soon approve the naming of the precinct, which recognises the long-standing contribution of Greek Australians in the Inner West.

Council's planned celebration in Marrickville Town Hall was postponed because of COVID-19 restrictions, but flew at Greek flag over the town hall to mark the occasion.

## Little Vietnam

Council has asked the Geographic Names Board to approve the name 'Little Vietnam' for the area along Illawarra Road between Marrickville and Warren roads.

The precinct has many Vietnamese restaurants and shops.

According to Marrickville – Rural Outpost to Inner City (Cashman & Meader – 1990), the Vietnamese were part of the 'third wave of migrants' that occurred post–1945.

"During the 1980s the Vietnamese-born moved into Marrickville as fast as the Greek-born moved out and by 1986 the Vietnamese were the second largest non-English-speaking group in Marrickville."



# Council must do everything possible to help you in the lockdown

At such a strange and difficult time it's the Council's responsibility to do everything possible to support local people to stay safe and get through the lockdown.

Council is working in close partnership with NSW Health and NSW Police to protect you and to expedite the vaccination of the Inner West community.

We are taking action to help you get through the lockdown, including:

- Seeking to provide up to \$400 in financial assistance to ratepayers who have lost income due to the lockdown
- Extending the availability of the Summer Hill Depot as a Covid-19 testing centre until the end of September and offering town halls and depots as vaccination hubs
- Turning the lights on at sporting fields, tennis and basketball courts until 9pm on weeknights for the duration of the lockdown to allow more opportunity for safe exercise outside work hours
- Ensuring tenants of Council properties are not evicted during the lockdown, and that affected businesses receive a deferral of rental payments
- Directing Council rangers to prioritise safety not issuing fines. Infringements are not being issued for overstaying in residential areas

## New public art


Council unveiled new public art earlier this year as part of the Perfect Match program.

## Summer Hill **Community Centre**

3Bridges, a not-for-profit organisation with extensive experience in operating community centres, has taken up operations at Summer Hill Community Centre.

The Centre will provide services including dementia social support groups, before and after school and vacation care, partnerships with the Portugal Madeira Club to deliver a men's mental health project and working with children from CALD and Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander communities at Marrickville West Public School.





## 50 years of CAMP

Council is installing a plaque at St John's Anglican Church parish hall in Balmain to commemorate the 50th anniversary of a milestone in Australian social history.

Campaign Against Moral Persecution (CAMP Inc), one of the first gay and lesbian rights organisations in Australia, held their first formal meeting there in 1971.

"Fifty years ago CAMP NSW envisaged a future where LGBTQIA+ people could walk proudly, hand in hand, on this ancient First Nation land, head held high with pride, without fear of violence, discrimination or hate," said a CAMP member.
