Key sports facilities fail to make the cut

The state government ditched several key elements of the Rozelle Parklands project recommended by its own expert working group, including an all-weather sporting field, tennis courts and street parking, leading to accusations the in-





Rozelle parkland stripped of key sporting amenities

It has been revealed that large parts of the sporting and community facilities promised for the Rozelle Parklands were secretly cut from the plans the Government announced last week.

An all-weather sporting field, public toilets, public car parking and two multi-purpose sports courts were all deleted from the final design without the government disclosing the cuts.

Inner West Mayor Darcy Byrne says the decision is a cruel sleight of hand by the State Government.

"Our community has been relying on this project after a couple of years of disruption to their lives from WestConnex construction and now the Government is shortchanging us again," Mr Byrne said.

"Not only is the Government under-funding the project, they are stripping it of vital sporting infrastructure.

"Providing a substandard park was never part of the plan.

"We've been warning for years that the Government was under funding the park promised in compensation for WestConnex construction impacts.

"At first there was no funding allocated to build the park, just a requirement for the road-builder to install a grass covering over the interchange.

"We eventually forced \$15m out of the Government but it has been clear all along that what they promised would cost closer to \$30m.

Supporting the Raise The Age campaign

Inner West Council recently resolved to add its full weight behind the campaign to raise the age of criminal responsibility in Australia. Currently, children as young as 10 can be arrested by police, charged with an offence, brought before court and sent to prison.

Council will be calling upon NSW and federal parliaments to raise the age of criminal responsibility to at least 14 years old and invest in community-led solutions.

- ► Choosing alternatives for wrapping paper - t-shirts, fabric off-cuts or reusable fabric gift bags.



Darrell Jackson Gardens upgrade unveiled

One of Summer Hill's most loved recreation spots has opened to the public after an impressive upgrade. The \$1.2m project was funded by Council along with grants from Everyone Can Play NSW, Cricket NSW and Tennis NSW.

The refreshed playground features new additions requested by the community including softfall surface, new equipment and shade sail. There's also a natural turf junior cricket oval with a new cricket pitch, a resurfaced skate park and a resurfaced tennis court and lighting upgrade. Improvements to the paths, bioswale stormwater treatment, tree and landscape planting also featured as part of this project.



Inner West Council has awarded hundreds of thousands of dollars in grants to fund 69 different community initiatives around the Inner West over a two-year period.

Among the winners was Diversity Arts Australia, who will commission 10 new works from Asian-Australian artists to respond to racism faced by the Asian community in the wake of COVID-19. Another deserving winner was Gladys Namokoyi for the Red Rattler Theatre, presenting a multidisciplinary performance encompassing dance and film to celebrate African culture and storytelling.
