

Lest we forget

The Inner West community will once again come together at services across the community to commemorate ANZAC Day. Inner West Council in conjunction with the Balmain Rozelle RSL Sub Branch will hold an ANZAC Day Dawn Service.

The Balmain War Memorial is a historic landmark on the peninsula. The memorial initially commemorated the local men who lost their lives in the Dardanelles campaign. The 38 local men who died in this campaign have their names listed on the four marble tablets on each side of the monument. During WWI, around 5000 Balmain local men enlisted – this was nearly the entire eligible men in the area. New names have been added over the years from later wars.

ANZAC services will also be held in Ashfield and Petersham and are open to everyone. Petersham RSL is also hosting an ANZAC event. ▶ Balmain Service, Balmain Rozelle RSL Sub Branch

New Tempe Reserve amenities block

Council has completed building the new amenities block for Tempe Reserve.

This upgrade is part of our overall investment in Tempe Reserve which has included upgrading the sportsfield's surfaces, flood lighting and upgrading the popular Robyn Webster Centre.

The new amenities block includes new modular sports amenities, change rooms, storage and a canteen.

Accessible amenities and pathways and new public toilets including an accessible toilet, have also been included in the new facilities.

FOGO is coming to Inner West schools

Food Organics and Garden Organics is expanding to include local Inner West schools.


Introducing FOGO provides a unique opportunity to divert a large volume of food waste from landfill.

In its first year of FOGO, Inner West Council collected 17,546 tonnes of FOGO - the equivalent of over 36,000 tonnes of CO2.

Weekly collections will be available to schools who choose to participate.

The FOGO service provides children with an opportunity to learn about caring for the environment, and turns environmental knowledge into action.

7 new raised pedestrian crossings

We've just delivered 7 new raised pedestrian crossings.

Raised crossings improve safety by better defining the crossing points and support pedestrian safety and driver behaviour at these locations.

Some of these crossings have replaced the existing at-grade flat crossings. All these works include upgraded signage and line marking.

Keep an eye out for them.





We have begun work on our second inclusive children's playground at Richard Murden Reserve in Haberfield Reserve.

This is the second of our 5 new inclusive playgrounds throughout the community.

Designed with input from the Touched by Olivia foundation, these playgrounds mean children of all ages and abilities can experience the benefits of play together.

The new playground will include inclusive play equipment including slides and climbing towers, an inground trampoline, sensory spaces and quiet areas and new BBQs and picnic areas for everyone to enjoy.

Making our streets safer

Council is delivering the InnerWest@40 project which will see safer speed limits of 40km an hour on local streets.

With \$1.8 million funding from Transport for NSW, this will be rolled out in Marrickville, Tempe, Enmore and Newtown in high pedestrian areas to make it safer for the community.

In terms of safety; at 50 km/hr a pedestrian only has a 10% average chance of surviving. While at 40km/hr, a pedestrian has a 60% average chance of surviving.

Look out for the new street signs and line markings.



The GreenWay will transform our community

The Greenway is nearing completion. The opening of this active transport, biodiversity, and public art corridor connecting the Cooks River to Iron Cove will truly transform the Inner West.

Having a continuous, direct connection between the south and north of the Inner West will create exciting new opportunities for local people.

After two decades of advocacy and now several years of planning and constructing our largest ever infrastructure project, we are only weeks away from opening the Greenway. Even better, with the Sydney Metro Sydenham to Bankstown line to be completed later this year, we will also have very fast trains running every four minutes across the south of the Inner West.


Combined, these two transport connections will change for the better the way that our whole community travels and open up new economic opportunities by attracting more people to the Inner West.

GreenWay nearing completion

We've hit another important milestone in the GreenWay.

At 8am on March 10, the last stage of the Longport Street tunnel under Lewisham West was excavated.

This tunnel will become a shared path and a microbat-friendly habitat and completes another link in this \$57 million project.

The GreenWay active travel corridor will run from the Cooks River to Iron Cove and will be completed this year.

Council abolishes childcare waitlist fees

In a recent council meeting, Inner West Council voted to abolish childcare waitlist fees from all Early Childhood Services.

Thanks to prudent financial management, it's possible to offer this cost of living relief to local families.

The high demand for early childhood education services in the Inner West means that families often need to join waitlists at multiple centres, compounding costs on family budgets with little to no certainty that they will obtain a place.

The removal of waitlist fees will apply to Council's pre-schools, early learning centres and family day care and come into effect later in July this year.





Mackey Park upgrade

Council has completed the upgrade of the Mackey Park sporting grounds.

The \$1.9 million investment has improved this much-loved space for locals and sporting clubs including the Marrickville Football Club and Marrickville Cricket Club. Improvements delivered include:

- Improved playing field surface and new turf
- Upgraded sporting ground irrigation and drainage
- ▶ New cricket nets
- ► Renewed synthetic cricket pitch
- ▶ New state-of-the-art LED floodlighting

The extra investment of \$5.5 million from Council and \$2 million from the AFL will secure Henson Park as a hub for women's AFL and the home of the mighty Newtown Jets.

The works will include:

- New coaches' boxes
- ▶ New public toilets
- ▶ A new canteen

Once all works are complete, Henson Park will be one of the premier AFLW venues in Australia. The final stage of renovation is planned for completion ahead of the 2026 community football season.

Green Living Centre free service


Did you know that you can borrow thermal imaging cameras from our Green Living Centre?

From Balmain Boy to Premier

Famous for saying 'Balmain boys don't cry', the Hon Neville Wran QC was one of Balmain's favourite sons. He spent his childhood in Nicholson Street, East Balmain and attended Nicholson St Primary school then Fort Street High.

From these humble beginnings in the Balmain of the 1930's he rose to become first a Solicitor then highly respected Barrister and eventually one of the State's longest serving and most popular Premiers.

His roots in Balmain were deep, in fact his greatgrandfather, Thomas Wran was the Master Stonemason who carved the coat of arms on the Balmain Courthouse in the 1880s.

His record in law reform, including the decriminalisation of homosexuality, has left a legacy of expanded civil rights that is unparallelled in the history of NSW.

At the recent Council meeting it was unanimously resolved that Neville Wran's legacy should be commemorated in the heart of the community that shaped him.

The soon to be dedicated Neville Wran Square, in the area in front of Balmain Courthouse and Town Hall, will be a fitting commemoration of the legacy of a working-class Balmain kid who went on to lead and modernise Sydney and NSW.



Happy 20th Mudcrabs

The Mudcrabs is a local community group that cares for the Cooks River by regularly collecting rubbish and restoring the bush along the river's banks.

In March this year, the Mudcrabs celebrated 20 years of Cooks River bushcare. They are always keen to welcome new volunteers and have regular activities anyone can join such as monthly bushcare events and bird surveys. Get involved and help save the Cooks River for future generations.


