Tempe Reserve opening

Inner West Mayor Darcy Byrne officially opened the Tempe Reserve upgrade at a sunny celebration on Saturday 7 May.

Over 1,500 people attended to admire the new facilities which include:

- New synthetic multipurpose sports field
- Five turf fields with new irrigation
- Stormwater drainage and harvesting
- Sports field lighting upgrade
- Four new cricket nets and two upgraded wickets
- New pathways and tree planting

The upgrade will benefit local sports clubs including football, rugby league, ultimate frisbee and cricket. Local clubs Marrickville Red Devils and Marrickville Cricket Club now have new home grounds.

Future plans for Tempe Reserve include a new \$2.5 million Tempe Reserve amenities building, a \$2 million sport lighting upgrade, new tennis and futsal courts and a upgrade of the indoor Robyn Webster Sports Centre.



First Council to move to 100% renewable electricity

Council will procure 100% of its electricity needs from renewable sources in a huge deal brokered with Southern Sydney Regional Organisation of Councils (SSROC) and ZEN Energy.

Electricity makes up around threequarters of Council's corporate carbon emissions, so going

100% renewable for electricity is a significant carbon reduction strategy.

Council is taking serious action on climate change by thinking globally and acting locally and has positioned itself as a national leader in environmental policy.

To achieve this, Council has committed to becoming 100% carbon neutral by 2025, having already become the first Council in Australia to achieve 100% divestment from fossil fuels in June 2019.

Inner West Council now leads Australia by raising the Aboriginal flag across Sydney's Inner West

The NSW flag has now been replaced by the Aboriginal flag at all locations the Inner West where only two flag poles are available.

The NSW Government continues to prevent the Aboriginal flag flying permanently over the Harbour Bridge, their excuse being an alleged Commonwealth protocol that the State flag must take precedence.

We have tested this and there is no legal or legislative requirement, it's just an outdated convention what has always been done.

We are seeking to set a positive example for State and Federal governments to follow our lead.

Badu Park facelift

Council is making public domain improvements to Wigram Road and Booth Street Annandale.

Design and construction of a pathway and cycleway along Johnstons Creek have commenced, and Badu Park has been upgraded, including landscaping, planting of native shrubs and trees, returfing and construction of a timber deck adjoining Fez Café.

The upgrade improves biodiversity outcomes and reduces urban heat.

The project is part of an overall



corridor master planned for new development and positive economic outcomes and is funded through the Parramatta Road Corridor Urban Transformation

Program, a NSW Government \$198 million initiative.

The project is slated for completion by the end of 2022. The focus is on improving safety, accessibility and the protection of trees.

The new service gives households greater flexibility with three key benefits:



Balmain Town Hall precinct revitalisation

Council will spend \$1.4m upgrading Balmain Town Hall this year and will consult with locals on revitalising the whole precinct, from Balmain PCYC to the new Balmain Square.

Improvements could include footpaths, tree planting, public art, new street furniture and enhancement of heritage.

Inner West Council will trial publicly accessible, kerbside and parking area Electric Vehicle (EV) charging stations.


The EV policy was unanimously endorsed at the April Council meeting.

Councillors noted that residents across the Inner West were calling out for EV charging stations and that more public charging stations meant fewer emissions and cleaner air across Inner West

Conducting a pilot now will help fast-track Council's EV infrastructure and provide valuable learnings for the EV strategy.
