# Supporting our SES volunteers

Council will grant free access to our local State Emergency Service volunteers following a proposal from Ashfield Ward councillor Jo Carlisle for free access to our Aquatic Centres for training.

Our Ashfield-Leichhardt and Marrickville unit volunteers play a vital role in protecting our community during emergencies and flood events and have been busy with the recent summer storms attending over 340 calls for assistance.

Regular access to swimming facilities is essential for our SES volunteers to develop their water rescue capabilities. Pool-based training provides a safe environment for practicing crucial rescue skills. This training is fundamental to both the operational readiness and safety of SES volunteers.

Council supports free, regular scheduled access to Council-operated swimming facilities for authorised training sessions by Ashfield -Leichhardt and Marrickville SES units.

This support includes the use of rescue equipment, including inflatable rescue rafts during these training sessions, subject to appropriate safety protocols. So, if you see the crew training, give them a wave – they are here to help the community out.

# 500 homes in Camperdown

Council has been pushing hard for more affordable housing throughout our community.

So it was very encouraging to join with Premier Minns and Minister Rose Jackson to announce that 500 new homes will be built at the former Westconnex dive site on Parramatta Rd, as part of the Government's essential worker build-to-rent plan. This is a well-located site that is long overdue for development.

At least 200 of these homes will be dedicated to essential workers such as paramedics, health workers, teachers and police, with below market rent charged.

In the current housing crisis, it's great to see that the NSW Government is working with Council to get houses built for the community.

# Book a garden organics collection

Residents can book kerbside Council clean-up collections as needed for:

- Household furniture
- White goods
- Mattresses
- Bulky garden organics items like large sticks, palm fronds and branches

Categories are collected by different trucks and taken to specialist facilities for recycling.

Garden organics placed next to wheelie bins without a booking

can't be collected as part of FOGO collections unless contained within the bin. FOGO bins are collected at night and bundled garden organics poses a safety risk to our collection crews.

If you have branches too large for the FOGO bin, book in a clean -up collection, or contact us if you need an extra FOGO bin at no additional charge.

Branches shouldn't exceed Im in length and 0.1m in diameter. Bookings should be no larger than 2m x 1m x 1m (two cubic metres) in size.

# Design of Leichhardt Oval upgrade

Inner West Council is making steady progress in designing the long-awaited renovation of Leichhardt Oval with Ernst and Young having been appointed as project managers and Cox Architecture brought on board to finalise the concept designs for the upgrade.

The concept designs are due

to be delivered in April 2025. Council will consult with its Stakeholder Design Panel to finalise the design.

While the historic Wayne Pearce Hill and Keith Barnes Stand will be preserved, Cox has been tasked with improving the spectator experience throughout the ground including upgraded seating, catering, toilet facilities and access to and from the ground as part of the contract.

Whether to undertake construction in 1 stage or 2 will be determined by Council once the designs are finalised.



## GreenWay Update

The GreenWay continues to take shape.

Significant works at Cadigal Reserve are nearing completion with the new boardwalk under Parramatta Road creating a continuous path from the Taverner's Hill light rail stop.

These new works mean that pedestrians and cyclists won't have to use the stairs or lifts to cross busy Parramatta Road.

Contractors worked inside the canal to complete the new, cantilevered walkway.

This GreenWay section connects the existing GreenWay north of Parramatta Road in Leichhardt with Cadigal Reserve in Summer Hill and all the way to the Cooks River in Earlwood and beyond.



#### Did you know that PL (Pamela) Travers, the creator of that most English of characters, Mary Poppins, spent her formative years in Ashfield?

First as a boarder at the long gone, Normanhurst School in Bland St from 1912 then from 1918 to 1924 with her mother and sisters at 17 (now 40) Pembroke St. Perhaps that's why "The east wind blew the nanny into 17 Cherry Tree Lane, London, where she worked her charms on a dysfunctional family".

The house in Pembroke St overlooks Ashfield Park where today there is a statue of Mary Poppins commemorating her famous creator.

## A new cycleway to connect Sydenham and St Peters


Attention cyclists. Council has started work on a much-needed cycleway upgrade from Sydenham Station to St Peters.
