Get active and make the most of where you live by looking at our new Active Inner West map.

On the back of our hugely popular Inner West Fitness Pass, we are now launching Active Inner West.

Active Inner West is a new map to help you see where all the Inner West's sport and recreational offerings are located.

Did you know that there are over 300 fitness classes available in Council facilities? Over 100 playgrounds and community sporting clubs, 43 dog exercise areas, 15 free-to-use tennis courts and 22 sporting courts – servicing everything from basketball and netball, to roller derby and even croquet.

The map also pinpoints locations for leisure activities where you can get out and be active by yourself, with friends or by connecting with new people in your community with similar active interests.

There's something for everyone to enjoy, no matter your fitness level!

Active Inner West is part of Council's commitment to not only encourage our community to get active but also provide safe places to connect with neighbours.

## Some of the improvements we are making


In this term of Council, we have instituted monthly Local Matters Forums and fortnightly mobile Customer Service Stalls. The Local Matters Forums allow residents to meet with the executive of Council and ward councillors at a local facility to hear first-hand the local issues that our community is facing. We've also established a
Customer Service Committee
made up of community members
and Councillors. The committee
meets monthly with the purpose
of working with Council to drive
continuous improvement in service.

As part of our commitment to constant customer service improvement, we are working on streamlining and improving several vital services.

For instance, the DA lodgment process has been streamlined with the establishment of a dedicated team to ensure quality and minimise delays with lodgments.

Our call centre staff are also working to constantly improve the way we answer your enquiries, and we seek feedback after every phone call which has resulted in an average rating of 4.3 out of 5. We've also increased resources in the call



**centre** so that 80% of your calls will be answered within 60 seconds.

We're improving our website by making navigation simpler and clearer. We have also allocated funding to streamline our portal so you can more easily log requests for information and make a payment online.

We have trained over 200 of our staff on writing with a customer focus and have reviewed more than 7,000 pieces of correspondence. We also send all new call centre staff on a five-week training course to improve the way we respond to

your enquiries and have reviewed how we can better respond with clear and relevant information, quickly and efficiently with 85% of customer issues now being resolved at the first point of contact.

The online Parking Permit
Application process is also
being simplified to make it more
customer-friendly, as well as
allowing residents to apply for more
than one permit type at a time.

We know there is more to do but we are committed to providing a customer experience that is second to none.

## Workshops for marketing smarts

#### Aquatics accolade

Inner West Council has won the prize for Excellence in Aquatics Supervision at The Royal Life Saving Society of NSW's night of nights, The Aquas.

The award recognises Council's effort and investment in aquatics safety through measures such as integrated training, staff development, safety audits and learn-to-swim resources. These initiatives, combined with diligent staff, have created a strong safety culture at our aquatic centres. Our 300 staff will continue this focus as we approach 2 million visits per year across five facilities and 17 bodies of water.

## Shaping the future of our local economy

Inner West business owners and key stakeholders recently gathered to hear from industry experts and provide input into Council's soon to be drafted Economic Development Strategy.

The two summits featured keynote speakers Erica Berchtold, CEO of The Iconic and Michael Rodrigues, NSW 24-Hour Economy Commissioner, Investment NSW.

Attendees gained insight into the hospitality and retail sectors, online shopping and the night-time economy. Representatives from six local Chamber of Commerce and industry associations also participated.

The event examined Inner West's strategic business advantages along with community wealthbuilding and future growth opportunities for the LGA.

Inner West Deputy Mayor, Philippa Scott was in attendance and said, "It's wonderful to see so many active and engaged business owners, government and industry representatives contributing to a positive vision for the inner west one that is vibrant, lively and diverse in every way."

Feedback from the summits will be used to inform the development of a new Inner West Economic Development Strategy.

## New 'Love Your Home Ground' smart bins Help keep our **Cooks River** clean, 📓 Get

Two 'smart' compactor bins have been installed along the Cooks River foreshore in Marrickville as part of the **EPA-funded 'Love Your Home** Ground' litter prevention project. The 120L bin can compact 660L of rubbish.

The bins use solar energy to power the compactor and sensor technology to feed data back to Council when the bins are nearing full. They're unique to the Cooks River and represent a year-long collaboration between Inner West Council, Cooks River Alliance, the NSW River Canoe Club and the NSW EPA.



### Rangers roll into new home ground


Council is excited to welcome the Sydney Rangers to their official new home ground at Tempe Recreation Reserve.

"We have been looking for a permanent home ground for a long time and it's fantastic to put down roots here as a club," said Rangers president Chris Hicks.

Sydney's only gay and inclusive men's soccer club, the Rangers now has exclusive access to two pitches for training and weekend matches.

Upgrades at Tempe include a new synthetic multi-purpose sports field and five turf fields with new irrigation.





## Muse or Machine at Addi Road Writers' Festival

The Addi Road Writers' Festival is on Saturday 20 May at the Addison Road Community Centre in Marrickville.

Organisers have curated a diverse program of writers and performers from 11am to 6pm.

Supported by Inner West Council through a \$10,000 Arts Project Grant, the festival will showcase speakers including writers, musicians, poets, social justice activists, fiction and non-fiction authors.
