

#### Strong budget - investing in our community

Inner West Council has adopted a budget for the 2023-24 financial year that keeps Council in a very strong financial position. Because of ongoing responsible management of public funds, Council is able to invest in improvements to services, renewing and improving critical infrastructure and community facilities.

Highlights of the budget include:

#### Investing in infrastructure

- ► Road renewal projects: \$9.4M
- ► Footpath improvements: \$3.9M
- ➤ Stormwater works to reduce flooding and water pollution: \$2.6M
- Pedestrian Access and Mobility Plan implementation: \$2M
- ▶ Cycleways: \$2.6M
- ▶ Traffic facilities: \$2.4M

#### Improved services

Council is committed to maintaining our parks and recreation spaces:

- HJ Mahoney Reserve: \$2.1M sports field upgrade and \$1.2M for amenities
- ▶ Tempe Reserve: \$1.1M sports field upgrade and \$2.8M for a new amenities block
- ▶ Leichhardt Oval Field No. 2: \$1M for new amenities block

- Henson Park: \$1.2M upgrade
- ► Camdenville Park: \$2.5M upgrade

#### **Community facilities**

- Greenway project: \$27.7M
- New Pride Centre in Newtown Town Hall: \$3.2M
- Aboriginal community hub: \$0.7M
- Revitalising main streets over two years: \$7.5M





At 10%, the Inner West has one of the highest percentages per capita of businesses and individuals driving our local, state and national creative economy.

In the past year, Inner West residents have composted more than 1,300 tonnes of food scraps.

In May 2023, 94% of our customer calls were answered within 60 seconds by Council and 95% of customers were served within 3 minutes at our service centres.

We know how frustrating bad potholes can be for locals. We set ourselves a service target and are proud to report that in the month of May we repaired all potholes within 2.6 days.



#### Camdenville Park gets the green light

After many years of negotiation with the NSW State Government due to WestConnex, Council has finally regained control of the much-loved Camdenville Park.

As a result of this successful advocacy, Council is now ready to deliver a \$2.5m upgrade to the park. Our designs for the park include:

- Sports field upgrade including new irrigation, turf, lighting, and warm-up area
- New shared path (walking and cycling)
- 3. New pedestrian circuit and link

- 4. BMX pump track
- 5. Little kids pump track
- 6. New central play space
- 7. Upgraded corner space
- 8. 'Peter Bulger Wetlands' investigation
- 9. Possible future parking
- 10. Amenities building renewal
- Water harvesting tank and rain garden

This is a big job and we will deliver it in two stages to minimise disruption, with completion planned for March 2025.

Renowned street artist Scott Marsh has painted an amazing portrait of Arran at Running Science on the corner of Darling Street and Victoria Road in Rozelle.

#### Leichhardt Oval upgrade one step closer

The "Eighth Wonder of the World" and Sydney's favourite suburban ground is one step closer to the renovation it so desperately needs with a preliminary plan for the upgrading of Leichhardt Oval ready for public engagement and input.

The development of these designs follows a decade-long struggle to win fair funding for this iconic sporting ground and valuable community asset.

Leichhardt oval is not just a stadium, it's a local institution. We have developed a modular plan with several levels of funding options, designed to simply bring Leichhardt Oval up to standard for the myriad sporting and community organisations who utilise the ground.

We will be submitting these design options to the State and Federal Governments. The options show that even a modest investment will make a big difference to all of the senior and junior men's and women's rugby league, soccer and rugby union teams who regularly use Leichhardt Oval.

With a fraction of the \$300 million that has been allocated to Penrith Stadium, we can provide decent seating, toilets, catering facilities and upgraded, female-friendly change rooms for all of the hundreds of teams who use the ground and the fans who support them.

#### Leichhardt Oval upgrade

The preliminary plans for the much-needed upgrade of Leichhardt Oval are now on public display.

Developed in conjunction with Cox Architects, sports clubs and Inner West residents, the masterplan preserves the heritage of the oval while providing several options for modernising and updating the facilities for fans and male and female teams.

Options in the modular design include:

- A museum of Inner West rugby league
- An additional grandstand at the northern end

- New and upgraded seating around the concourse
- Two options for upgrades to the western grandstand
- Improvements to accessibility and amenity around the oval

We are currently undertaking another round of public engagement so fans, residents and users of Leichhardt Oval can give feedback which will be incorporated into the final masterplan.

### Doctors for electrification

Dr Lai Heng Foong, senior emergency physician and chair of the Public Health and Disaster Committee of the Australian College of **Emergency Medicine and** Inner West resident, is actively endorsing the current national electrification campaign. As an advocate for environmental health, she stresses the importance of transitioning away from gas appliances to alleviate respiratory illnesses, particularly among vulnerable groups. Dr. Foong states, "The evidence is clear for changing out of gas appliances for household members with asthma and respiratory illnesses... cooking with gas is estimated to be responsible for up to 12% of the burden of childhood asthma in Australia."


History

#### Rugby league was born in the inner west

On 20 April 20 1908, at Birchgrove Oval, the Sydney sporting public were introduced to a brand new form of football that would come to dominate the northern states from that day forward.

A double header featuring Eastern Suburbs v North Sydney and Balmain v Western Suburbs opened the first ever rugby league season. The Tigers beat Wests 24-0 and rugby league was born. There were eight Sydney teams in that first season and four of them, Balmain, Newtown, Glebe and Western Suburbs were from the Inner West. Two years later the Inner West claimed five of the eight when the Annandale 'Dales' replaced Newcastle in the competition.

Sadly, none of the Inner West foundation teams are stand-alone in the NRL today but the Wests Tigers carry the flag for Balmain and Wests, while the Newtown Jets and the Glebe 'Dirty Reds' are both still going strong in other competitions.





# Special entertainment precincts central to arts recovery



Inner West Council is excited to look at rolling out four new Special Entertainment Precincts (SEPs) – in Marrickville, Leichhardt, Rozelle and Balmain to help revitalise the arts and music sectors.

A motion to commence early engagement with the community was passed at Council's June meeting, which also endorsed looking into an additional SEP in Dulwich Hill.

Feedback has been overwhelmingly positive for Enmore Road to become an SEP, following a successful trial in September.

A SEP status includes extended live music and outdoor dining hours, and a simplified noise management and complaints process.

The initiative is one of 14 in the Arts and Music Recovery Plan, endorsed by Council in May, based on feedback from the Inner West Arts Summit.

Council has also welcomed the creative community into our Town Halls as part of a series of open days showcasing space for future creative use.

As part of a longer-term strategy, the open days feed into a new framework which will support inclusive, accessible and equitable access to space for the creative sector.

More than 200 people visited our Town Halls across 7 weekends, sharing their thoughts and needs for consideration. Artists selected from an open expression of interest process will now occupy space until the end of the year before a framework is implemented from March 2024 onwards.


