Get ready for the new Haberfield Centre and Library

The historic Haberfield Centre and Library reopens in May after major renovations.

The upgrade gives the local community a modern, bright space to work, study and meet:

- Four community rooms with A/V available for hire
- Refreshed collection including bilingual picture books, school resources, junior graphic novels and readers, robots and new Italian fiction
- Plenty of space to work and study with wifi, laptop benches, computers, scanning and printing facilities

- The building is fully accessible to wheelchairs and prams
- Improvements in energy use and water management have been built into the design

As well as the library's normal programming there are a number of free activities and programs for the first month to celebrate the new space.

Radar speed displays

Council's new digital radar speed displays are not enforcement devices. They assist in reducing speeds on roads by showing vehicles speeds to motorists – a way to alert drivers they are exceeding the speed limit.

Driving too fast is the single biggest contributor to death and injury on NSW roads.





Town hall upgrades

Petersham Town Hall

Petersham Town Hall portico now has an integrated access ramp.

The Crystal and Frederick Street entrance fully accessible ramp/ walkway provides equitable and inclusive access.

Tactile indicators and handrails have been installed, along with new pavers and tiles. The landscaping includes some seating and bike rails.



Leichhardt Town Hall

The much-loved and iconic Leichhardt Town Hall's interior has had a heritage makeover, in line with the dramatic exterior facelift undertaken two-and-ahalf years ago.

The upgrade of Marrickville Town Hall façade is expected to be completed in June.



Council asks government to speed up 'exempt developments'

Council has written to the NSW Planning Minister requesting the urgent approval of the Extended Trading Hours and Cultural Activities planning proposal.

The proposal would speed up planning rules so musicians, actors and visual artists could use vacant spaces in industrial zones and main streets for small scale artistic and cultural events.

"The finalised policy has been submitted to the State Government. We are waiting for them to gazette the policy so that these new, commonsense rules can be rolled out in 2021," Inner West Mayor Darcy Byrne said.

Henson Park upgrade

The \$2.558m upgrade of Henson Park will be completed in late May.

Works included:

- Upgrade the turf and underlay soil to suit elite standard sport
- Install a stormwater harvesting and treatment system to reduce the use of town water for irrigation
- Install new field drainage system, including recycling of water
- Upgrade irrigation system
- Renew wiring to sports light poles

\$24 million to save live music and performance venues

Following the announcement that iconic Newtown live music venue The Old 505 Theatre would close at the end of March, I held a crisis summit to discuss ways to help the ailing industry.

Attendees of the summit unanimously called for immediate action from the NSW Government to save venues across Sydney, while also discussing other ways to resuscitate the industry.

Three days later, our community's grassroots campaign was successful. This saw the NSW Government finally agree to a \$24 million stimulus package to save live music and performance venues impacted by the COVID-19 pandemic.

I extend my sincere thanks to Save Our Stages and Music NSW, who led the campaign over many months.

Without this funding, dozens of iconic venues across Sydney were set to close their doors within weeks. The situation is still dire for live music in this city, but this win means we live to fight another day.

"This Artseat puts a face to refugee families and highlights a shared goal of wanting a safe, stable place to bring up our families supported by the community around us," Sharon said.
