Charlotte Street at Bland Street, Ashfield – Proposed Kerb Blister Islands & New Kerb Ramps Have Your Say

Council is planning to improve safety by constructing new landscaped kerb blister islands and kerb ramps in Charlotte Street, Ashfield (at its intersection with Bland Street). The proposal aims to improve pedestrian and motorist safety by better defining the existing traffic and parking lanes through the provision of constructed landscaped islands which also provides safer refuge for pedestrians wishing to cross Charlotte Street.

The Plan

The following works are proposed and are illustrated on the attached plans: Charlotte Street at Bland Street, Ashfield (Plan No. 10228):

- Construct 4 new landscape concrete kerb blister islands, 3 with integrated kerb ramps;
- Construct 5 new kerb ramps;
- Reconstruct surrounding footpaths adjacent to the new kerb ramps;
- Adjust the existing "Stop" linemarkings to improve motorist safety (as shown on the plans);
- Install any required signs associated with the works;
- Re-mark existing pavement markings where affected by the works

Please refer to the attached Consultation Plan (Plan No.10257) which illustrates the proposed works.

Parking Changes

This proposal will not result in the loss of any legal on-street parking spaces.

Streetlighting

The existing lighting is deemed adequate and therefore there will be no changes to the existing street lighting due to the proposed works.

What happens next?

Council has not yet made any commitment to change the traffic and parking arrangements in the street. A report, together with the community's comments and this proposal, will be considered by Council's Local Traffic Committee at its meeting on 20 November 2023. The Committee will make recommendations for Council to consider at the Council meeting on 5 December 2023.

Council will notify everyone who provided comments of the final decision.

These works are expected to be undertaken during the 2023/2024 financial year, subject to the outcome of this community engagement, final approvals, and budget allocations. No firm construction date is yet available, and residents will be notified further before any work starts in the street.
