- 5. Accessible ramp with handrails doubles as splash play zone
- 6. Play pontoon
- 7. Shark net

About the project

We're building an iconic and picturesque place where the community can drop in for a dip after a walk or run on the Bay Run.

The design will deliver a family oriented recreational facility and provide safe, accessible swimming for the whole community.

A new accessible pathway at the site will integrate the swimming area with existing features of the parkland.

Water quality assurance

The approval process involved two years of extensive environmental impact research, river depth and floor quality testing. Water quality testing has been carried out since 2018 in collaboration with Sydney Water, NSW Government's Beachwatch and the Parramatta River Catchment Group.

Beachwatch monitoring equipment onsite will allow Council to establish real-time water quality notification using methods such as smart phone apps, hotlines and signage.
