CRITICAL INVESTIGATION – DISSEMINATION OF INFORMATION:

The members who were present will allow Council to use the information gained within the critical investigation for the purpose to inform Council and Council staff of the Aboriginal history and heritage that they divulged during interviews.

INDIGENOUS SURVIVAL MEMORIAL:

Council had proposed that there be an establishment of a 'Frontier War Memorial', however in the November Council meeting it was decided that 3 Aboriginal Survival Memorials across the LGA would be a better outcome for the Aboriginal communities that make up the IWC LGA. Council staff proposed sites are Balmain East, Ashbury & Tempe. Community Services & Culture staff will present a report back to Council on the proposed costs and locations for these memorials later in 2019.

ABORIGINAL ACTION PLAN:

There needs to be an Aboriginal Plan written to help guide Council, Councillors and staff to work with the Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander communities. The former Councils had the following Aboriginal Plans

Former Leichhardt & Ashfield Councils = Reconciliation Action Plan (RAP)

Former Marrickville Council = Belonging Plan (Draft) for over 10 years.

Discussed what the differences are between the two plans RAP

 - Actions which are the responsibility of the whole Council, not just the Aboriginal Programs Unit

 - reported by actions achieved annually to Reconciliation Australia

Belonging Plan

- written by the Aboriginal & Torres Strait Islander communities and people
- Practical actions that help guide Council, Councillors & staff working in/with the Aboriginal community.

STEEL PARK COMMUNITY ROOMS

Council is providing a small space for the Aboriginal community to meet and gather. It will be located at Steel Park. (see diagrams attached) This has been put out for tender and we are awaiting the final estimates before building goes ahead. It should be completed by June 2019.

RECONCILIATION WEEK

2019 IWC will be part of the ERLGATSIF Pauline McLeod Awards which will be held at Woollahra Council in May. The PMA's are for Primary Schools with an Art Competition, Secondary Schools with a Film Competition and then the Community Awards for Reconciliation which has both a Youth and General category.

EDGE – LAUNCH GREENWAY/LILYFIELD

EDGE is IWC equivalent to VIVID. Council is launching different areas across the LGA with this program. It is about showcasing the arts, artists and the creativity that makes up the Inner West. The next EDGE launch will be at Lilyfield on the Greenway which will be on Saturday 30th March 2019. This day will be a mixture of different event from ecological to young people's areas Wanders Football Club as well as the production companies that are housed around that area are all involved. So come along and have a picnic with the family and check out the artistic expression and vision of the Inner West.
