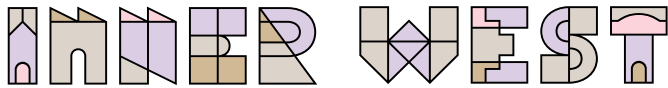

Attachment One: Discussion on developing Community Strategic Plan

1. LDG Purpose

You may remember from our group's terms of reference document that:

'The purpose of all advisory committees and working groups is to support Council to implement the Community Strategic Plan - Our Inner West 2036 through initiatives outlined in Council's Delivery Program and actions outlined in Council's annual Operational Plan and Budget'

2. What is the Community Strategic Plan (CSP)?

Our Inner West 2036 - A community strategic plan (CSP) for the Inner West Community identifies the community's vision for the future, long term goals, strategies to get there and how to measure progress towards that vision. It was developed in 2017/18 through extensive community consultation.

3. What is the Delivery Program (DP)

The Delivery Program (DP) is a statement of commitment to the community from each newly elected council that translates the community's strategic goals into clear actions. It is the primary reference point for all activities undertaken by council during its term of office. It allows council to determine what is achievable over the next four years, what the priorities are, and how programs will be scheduled.

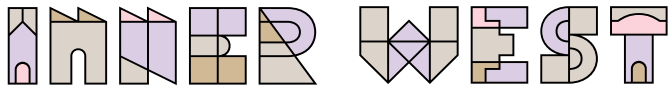
4. What is happening now?

Now three years into the 20-year plan, Council is checking in with the community to make sure the CSP still reflects its priorities and concerns for the future of the Inner West. As local democracy group members you have an important role and specific tasks to do for this review in order to fulfil the group's purpose in our Terms of Reference.

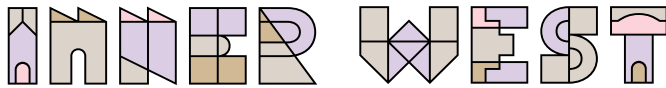
5. Time Frame

Council

- 4 December – Local Government Election
- 22–23 December – new Council determined (expected)
- 29 December – Mayoral election

Community Strategic Plan and Delivery Program Review Engagement

- Now to 12 December – Engagement with community including Local Democracy Groups
- 12 December 21 to Feb 22 – Engagement results analysed and staff will be drawing high level initiatives and yearly actions from the strategic plans which have been developed over the past three years
- February 22 – Results presented to new elected Council to inform their decision making. A revised CSP and new draft 4 year Delivery Program will be prepared
- March 22 – We will update you of the progress
- April to May 22 – We will ask for your input for one final time when the draft Reviewed CSP, 4 Year Delivery Program and resourcing documents are on public exhibition this will be the LDGs' final significant task to guide future focus and help set council priorities for the next 4 years. The new 4 year Delivery Program will start on 1 July 2022.



- April to May 22 – All LDGs will take part in a review process before the end of their term on 30 June 2022
- Ultimately Council will decide what happens to the LDGs beyond June 30 2022 but we anticipate that the structure will be renewed and there will be further opportunities to participate.

6. Ask them if they have any questions before you move onto the tasks

7. Task 1 CSP Strategies

Share the main Outcome/s and Strategies you located in the CSP during the meeting prep. Let them know that they are going to review all the Strategies that are connected to at least one specific Outcome but they can also decide to review more if they wish.

- Outcomes are the community's vision for *where we want to be*.
- Strategies describe *how we are going to get there* at a high level.

Remind members that the CSP requires many partners to implement – it's not Council's plan but a whole of community plan. Partners may include state and federal government, community organisations, NGOs, business and individuals.

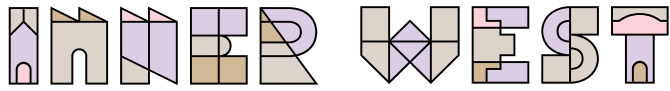
For each strategy chosen:

- Note down Strategy and its number ie *Outcome 4.1 Strategy 1*
- Confirm the Outcome is still appropriate or recommend changes
- Confirm the strategy is still appropriate or recommend changes
- If change is recommended, provide reasons why
- Nominate who would be the community partners assisting Council to deliver the strategy

8. Task 2 Delivery Program

Explain that there is a link between the strategic work these groups have done over the last three years and the new Delivery Program.

Over the last 3 years a number of Strategic Plans have been adopted or are in draft form in Council. For example, this LDG will see their work represented in the following plans – **share the list of those you identified in the meeting prep.**



Explain Information from all the strategic plans and this community engagement will be presented to the new councillors early in 2022.

Ask what are the top 3- 5 priorities that you would like the new councillors to commit to for their term? This may be from a strategic plan or the local knowledge of your group members.
