Committee members were briefed by Kendall Banfield (Senior Transport Planner) and their feedback sought on the following: 1. What are <u>your</u> main parking issues? 2. What are <u>your</u> ideas for a best practice parking strategy? Detailed feedback was taken by Mr Banfield and Committee Members have a been given until Friday the 2nd of July21 to provide additional thoughts.	This feedback will be considered during preparation of the Parking Strategy
		 In summary member feedback included: need for recognition on the true costs of private cars; inclusion of bike parking; measures should encourage use of active and public transport modes; consideration of the embedded carbon in basement parking structures; need to support the principles of the ITS through the Parking Strategy; 	

- kerbside parking should include consideration of ways to discourage parking of non-motorised vehicles such as trailers and caravans;
- care should be taken to ensure that bike parking is attractive, visible and readily available 24/7;
- consideration should be given to reviewing the narrow streets options in Balmain, particularly noting it imp on pedestrians and emergency vehicles;
- consideration should be given to delivery vehicle parking and whether such should be accommodated on-site;
- need to ensure that there is sufficient bike parking near transport nodes;
- consideration should be given to opportunities increase car share parking;
- Measures should be introduced to ensure that sightlines are maintained at intersections, particularly noting the tendency for vehicles to park dangerously close to corners;
- the impact on kerbside parking on bus routes and cycle lanes should be considered;
- electric vehicle parking should be included;
- residential parking permits should attract a fee;
- consideration should be given to modelling the urban heat implications of the various parking scenarios being considered;
- it is essential to ensure that the community is comprehensively consulted on this project;
- the appropriateness of timed parking restrictions should be examined;
