Selina McGrath Wall2Wall

Selina McGrath's mural depicts an historical snapshot of Annandale in the 1850's. A time when the area was relatively under developed and the natural wetlands were home to diverse native wildlife such as dragonflies and frogs.

In this work she has cleverly contrasted the bold repetitive structure of the Whites Creek aqueduct with the biodiversity of the original environment.

Christina Stead

Christina Stead was an Australian novelist and short-story writer acclaimed for her satirical wit and penetrating psychological characterisations. She died in Balmain Hospital in 1983 at the age of 81.



She spent much of her life overseas but kept her connection to her country of birth via letters to her cousin. She spent a large portion of her life unrecognized for her brilliance as a writer living in obscurity in England during the 50s and 60s. It wasn't until later in her life that she was recognized for her excellence, and was awarded the Patrick White Award in 1974, the same year in which she returned to Australia.

In the final year of her life, she was taken into the palatial home of her personal doctor, Dr Helena Berenson, who looked after with great care. Dr Berensen considered her a 'very great lady', and her home was the exceptionally beautiful High Gothic Castle, The Abbey, located on Johnston St, Annandale.

Stead was able to indulge her taste for the Gothic in a location replete with a Gothic spire, windows and gargoyles. She was given a home in the tiny former Butler's pantry until she was eventually taken to hospital, where she died at the age of eightyone, convinced that her husband, Blake had come for her.
