DESCRIPTIO	N:			
A most harmonious and intact group of houses of the same basic form but with varied detailing. Each house has a hipped main roof with gablet vents and a single thrusting bay (except for No.11, a corner house, which has two projecting bays, one facing each street.) Most houses have superimposed bay windows with bracketted hood, gable embellishment and textured or decorated tympani. All have slate roofs with terra cotta trim, or terra cotta tiles. All have turned or fretted timber verandah decoration and verandah floors of encaustic tiles. Chimneys are of brick with stucco or roughcast embellishment. Some have brick or roughcast verandah balustrading, bichromatic brickwork, crenellated ridges or ripple iron window hoods, and foliated stucco/roughcast decoration. All have common brick walling to those faces which do not address the street. No. 23 has a bullseye window.
