

It appears that the original church had its roof raised to accommodate an upper storey commercial use; its fenestration was altered,							
an extension at the front replaced the porch to provide accommodation for the A. & D. U. F. S., and retail premises were added. Some							
evidence of the earlier building remains at the rear (west) end.
