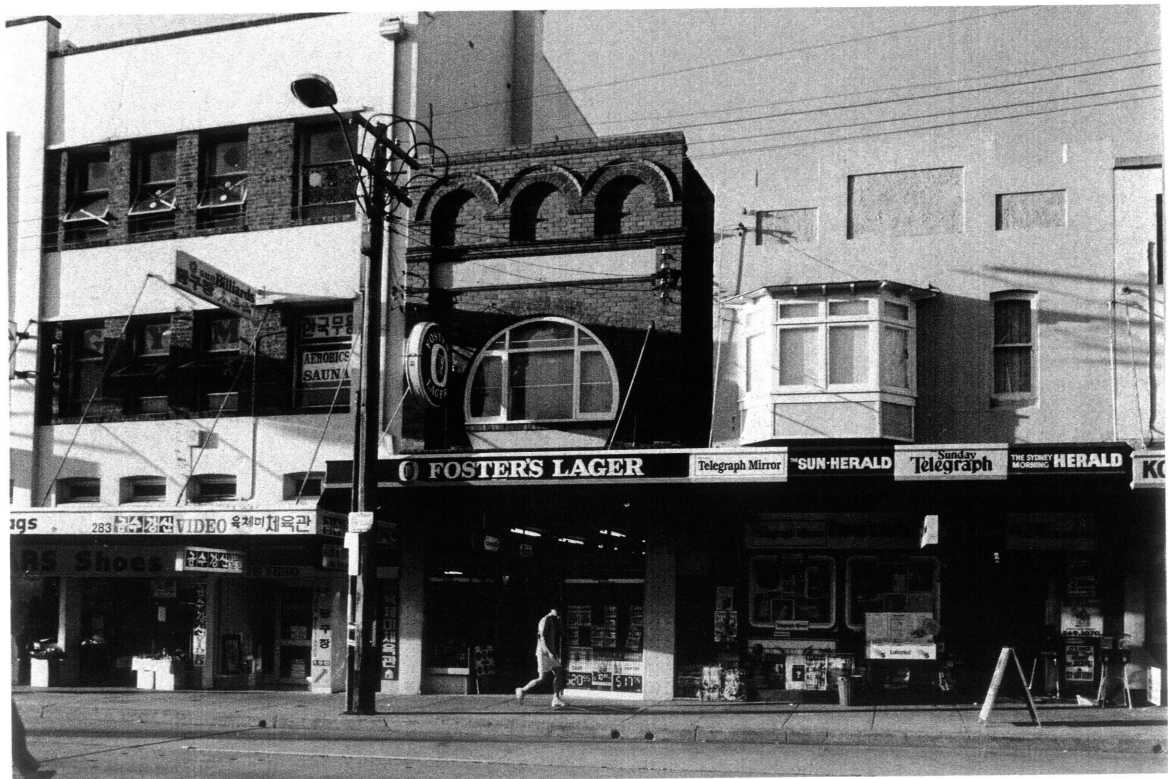

<p>HISTORICAL THEMES:</p> <p>State Themes: Booms and busts</p> <p>Local Themes: The Village of Ashfield The boom years; local government and services Industry, commerce and retail trade.</p>		
<p>HISTORICAL NOTES</p> <p>This shop is erected on part of the original 1838 subdivision of the Village of Ashfield. John Smith, one of the aldermen elected to Ashfield's first Borough Council, purchased three lots in 1856. He lived in a cottage on the land, and it was there that Council meetings were held for some years. John Smith died in 1872, and his widow in 1893, after which the property was subdivided and sold in 1899. Further sales took place in 1908 and 1909 and it is at this time that the present building was erected.</p>

<p>INFORMATION SOURCES:</p> <p>Materials: Face brick walling of red-brown bricks, tuck pointed. Roof not visible.</p> <p>Exterior: Two-storey shop-&-dwelling unit on a narrow commercial site. Shopfront altered below more recent suspended steel footpath awning.</p> <p>Interior: Not inspected.</p> <p>Styles: Federation Free Style.</p>		
<p>DESCRIPTION:</p> <p>Above the awning this facade consists of a large moon window opening, divided into three lights and having a 3-ring arch of darker bricks. Above this is a high parapet with a blind arcade of three arches with moulded brick trim and cornice.</p>		
<p>MODIFICATION:</p> <p>Shop front altered. Awning altered. It is possible that the first floor window was originally the opening of an upper balcony.</p>
