on two unusual round, tapered columns finished in rough cast, with flat square caps. The front of the house is tuckpointed up to about 2m.						
high and roughtcast above and into the front gable. The side walls are of commons. The front windows are leaded, with Art Nouveau rose						
designs. The front fence is of later brick.
