A substantial house now accessed from itts side street (Ormond) but originally addressing Bruce Street, i.e. facing south. Its roof is					
unusually steep, contrasting with the verandah roof which springs from a line close under the main eaves. An "L" shaped verandah					
terminates against the thrusting bay, which is a hipped gable form having a heavy, scalloped timber bargeboard. At the rear end of the verandah there is a single-storey appendage. The two level verandah has the full panoply of iron lace, the balcony panels being of					
fleur-de-lys pattern. The chimneys are prominent those at the parimeter beging curred about the pattern.
