History of the Item

This allotment was transferred to accountant John Williams in November 1911, but he did not build upon it for ten years. The Sands Directory for 1922 was the first to list these dwellings, occupied by tenants. Williams died about this time and the property passed to his widow Sarah.

Physical Description

Semi-detached pair of dwellings with face brick walls. Hipped roof with gablet at peak and small gables over each porch. Under the eaves, each front gable is covered with plaster sheets with timber cover strips. The roof of both dwellings is now clad with concrete tiles which reaches down to cover the front porch as well. Each front porch is supported by squared timber posts standing on a substantial brick balustrade with a top course of darker bluish-purple face bricks. Casement windows in sets of four face the porch of each dwelling. Coloured panes at the top of each casement. Original chimneys appear to have been lost. Number 42 has a modern brick fence. Number 44 has a fence of square tipped timber pickets.
