

DESCRIPTION:							
A two-storey house of traditional Victorian asymmetrical form. A single s							
from the main gabled bay, but the double hung window above does not provide direct access to the balcony. Traceried barges and label							
moulds give a faintly "Gothic" flavour to the design. The two-level verandah has very slender columns, an intact iron lace assemblage of							
frieze/fringe/brackets and balustrading, and a skillion slate roof. There is a recent picket front fence having posts with pineapple tops,							
a symbol of hospitality. Palms, including the Cabbage Palm, <u>Livistona australis</u> , enhance the setting.
