and the cutting down of trees. The Ashfield Recreation Ground Company was established in 1885, with Frederick Clissold as major shareholder. The company went into liquidation in 1887 and the still operating recreation ground was transferred to J. W. Cliff, a well known land developer in the area. The Sydney Morning Herald of 21 April 1888 advertised "Ashfield Recreation Ground and Garden Palace Skating". The recreation ground band attended every Tuesday, Thursday and Saturday evening. The facilities could be booked for skating parties, balls, sports and picnics, bicycle sports and fetes. On December 8 1888, 4000 people witnessed the first planned intentional parachute descent from a balloon (S.M.H 10.12.88). A few months later another parachute descent was made by a "Professor Jackson". Two years later another "Professor" used Hammond Park, but this time for a balloon ascent. In 1908 it was bought by J. F. McKimm, celebrations a parachutists again descended on the park.
