	using arrangement of four occupancies, the end one of which is at	the Elizabeth S	Street corne	r. The first floor facade, mostly original,			
is divided into four bays by boldly rusticated piers having capitals which support a moulded entablature. Above this there is a panelled							
parapet, and above the piers are pedestals which originally supported stucco urns. There are two semicircular headed windows in each							
bay, with moulded surrounds and keystones, and a string course at impost level. The corner of the group is splayed and has a blind							
window, above which is a prominent pediment motif bearing the date 1888 (The Centennial Year). Around the corner in Elizabeth Street							
the pilastrated mode of the front continues at ground floor level also. The slope of the whole site downwards to the east permits garages							
and yards at basement level facing the rear land.							
MODIFICATION:							
All shopfronts modernised. Fairly recent steel suspended footpath awning. Most parapet ums missing. Two windows have been altered.
