**History of the Item**

This land was subdivided in 1937 and this allotment was transferred to Gabriel Mahboub, storekeeper of Summer Hill, and his wife Mary in July 1937. They mortgaged the land in September 1937 to an insurance company probably to erect these flats.

**Physical Description**

Two storey brick block of flats with some elements of Inter war Art Deco style. A hipped roof clad with Marseilles terra cotta tiles covers the building. The walls are of dark face bricks. Lighter brown texture bricks are used for contrast on the entrance, around the stairwell window and as soldier courses above windows. Double hung sash windows with leadlights are used on the front facade. The front fence consists of a low wall decorated top row of bricks and short piers all built of bricks identical to the building.
