A group of three matching houses, Nos. 113 and 114 being an attached pair while No. 112 is free standing and slightly wider. No. 112								
has a verandah divided into two bays by a round cast iron column at ground floor and a plate column above. The iron ensemble comprises								
brackets at ground floor and friezes, fringes, brackets and balustrade at first floor. The windows have raised stucco segmentally								
arched window heads with incised decoration. The eaves stops are also decorated with incised foliation and are supported on consoles with lion heads. Above are strong uma. No. 110 heads are stops are also decorated with incised foliation and are supported on consoles								
with lion heads. Above are stucco urns. No. 112 has the date "1886" in modern leaded glass in the front door transom light. Fence posts are of painted stone, one at No. 112 bearing the house name in incised lettering.								
MODIFICATION:								
No. 112 has a later ground floor verandah balustrade.								
The convex verandah roofs of Nos. 113 and 114 have been replaced by straight sheeting.								
	The urns on top of the eaves stops of 113 and 114 have gone.
