the floor level of the attic. In the centre of the facade there is a dormer motif with a hipped gable roof and a large scaled three light					
window having barley sugar mullions and semicircular arches. The front verandah has cast iron plate columns and a steep roof of					
ogee profile. The decorative ensemble comprises frieze, fringe and bracket. There are windows in the end gables. The gable barge work					
is fret-sawn. A tesselated tile path winds from the gate to a set of concrete steps ascending to the verandah floor.
