ever registered. After Fyle's death in 1887 his daughter was able to prove it had been her father's property. In 1912, under the provisions of the Public Works Act, the Railways and Tramways Constructing Authority resumed the land for the construction of the Railway from Belmore and Wardell Road to Glebe Island and Darling Harbour. By then John Fyle's daughter was dead. Her descendants were paid £1094.10.0. In 1916 the Commissioner of Railways conveyed to Mungo Scott Ltd. The residue of land no longer required for railway work. Mungo Scott paid £3000. Two years later an additional small portion, near Edward Street, was added. Construction of the mill complex began after this.
