History of the Item

This land was subdivided in 1937 and it was transferred in July 1937 to builder Sidney Brightman who erected this block of flats.

Physical Description

Two storey brick block of flats in Inter war Art Deco style. A hipped roof clad with Marseilles terra cotta tiles covers the building. The central stair has been used to create a feature with its strong verticality. Fluted pilasters are on each side of this main stairway and at the ends of the building. The main building is built of brown face bricks with darker texture bricks used for decorative features. The side walls are constructed of common bricks. Multi-paned glass double doors lead into the central stairway. The stairway window is used as a feature of the building and is composed of diagonal glazing bars supporting frosted glass. Recessed porches face the street from all the front flats. These porches usually highlighted with dentilated brickwork and bricks laid as soldier courses. One of these porches has been enclosed.
