This cottage stands upon part of Allotn		

This cottage stands upon part of Allotment 37 Section 2 which was held by a variety of owners after the estate was subdivided. It was transferred to Margaret Beale, wife of builder James Henry Beale of Summer Hill, in May 1901. This land was immediately mortgaged and Beale built an identical pair of single fronted cottages on the land (now 68 and 70 Kensington Road). The land was cut into half and this part of it with the house now known as 70 Kensington Road upon it was transferred to Michael O'Keefe, clerk of Leichhardt and his wife Jane in September 1901. They appear to have let the house to tenants.

Physical Description

Single fronted single storeyed Queen Anne/Federation cottage built on a narrow frontage. A longitudinal hipped roof with a gablet facing the street runs down the spine of this cottage. New Marseilles terra cotta tiles have replaced the original roofing material. A stuccoed chimney projects from the roof. The front verandah is supported on turned timber posts with modest Art Nouveau brackets and a shallow plain timber valance. The tiles on the verandah floor have been replaced with modern glazed tiles. The wrought iron fence the front is not original, nor is the wrought iron railing which has been added to the verandah.
