	Due to constant usage a significant hollow has developed. It fills up quickly when it rains and as it dries out becomes a muddy quagmire. Individual pavers or bricks will be quickly stolen so a concrete square would be the best solution.	BA: suggest using recycled pavers/bricks, as cement is not environmentally sustainable. JK: concerned about vandalism
Lord Street Proposal comments: Nick Chapman, Alex Lofts	Last time they put in a DA, we proposed the following enhancements: - traffic calming, parking rationalisation (e.g. introducing some angle parking) and landscaping of Lords Rd - stormwater improvements (including water sensitive urban design) in the vicinity of the tunnel (which always floods) - establishment of a separated walking/cycle link (or significantly wider footpath) from Foster St lights to the Hawthorne Canal tunnel/mural - publicly accessible pedestrian links through the development from Lords Rd to Lambert Park - a new North/South pedestrian link to connect Lords Rd to Marion Street, running along the edge of the development on the eastern side of the light rail embankment. Tree clearing in the light rail corridor (Transdev) update: Bronwyn Holland	Transdev Sydney Light Rail issued a permit to Sydney Trains who engaged a contractor to conduct some works on their behalf at this location. Transdev are currently working with Sydney Trains to review the completion standards of these works. Once this review is completed, it will allow to plan for the implementation of follow-up actions, including correcting any vegetation damages and ensuring future similar works are conducted within standards.	BH: submitted what arose out of discovery, received letter of apology from TransDev. Debris was taking from one problematic site, but not the other. JB/BA: need closer watch of agencies working within GW corridor. NC: urban ecology used to do this but are now under resourced.
