Review of challenge questions	Committee members were notified of the specified Challenge Questions that were adopted at the June Council Meeting. Committee members were asked to keep these questions in mind as we progressed through the briefings and study reviews. 	Challenge Questions: 1. How can we better connect to public transport to further facilitate sustainable travel and reduce road congestion and parking reliance?

	Committee members would like to continue dealing with the Challenge Questions as high-level, long-term challenges that can be kept in mind as with other studies are considered. Members felt that the	

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	questions could not be dealt with effectively at a Local Democracy Group level.	
Great Inner West Walk	Members were provided with a briefing on The Great Inner West Walk Study and were invited to provide early feedback for consideration in the draft Study. The briefing overview provided identified missing links, key benefits and objectives.	<ul> <li>Council staff will consider the group's comments and relay them to the consultants to integrate into the draft Study as appropriate:</li> <li>Missing link identified on Unwins Bridge Road. As a whole, the south of the LGA requires a more attention.</li> <li>Lilyfield Road and its parallel streets have steep gradients. Other forms of transport should be considered for this section of the walk.</li> <li>Sydenham Station area upgrades should be integrated as part of the Great Inner West Walk</li> <li>Intersection crossings are the main barriers to walking. The Study should focus on more difficult intersections which may require higher level support and/or intervention, and to consider replacing signalised crossings with zebra crossings on less busy streets.</li> <li>Walking speed should be considered throughout the development of the Study, particularly on how long a walk should be.</li> <li>Bus stops are traditionally along former tram lines and are a good determinant for walking</li> <li>Wayfinding is crucial as part of this project</li> <li>For residential areas, consider linking them with the Active Travel to Schools project for safer routes and potential educational walks</li> </ul>

General business	<ul> <li>The Chair asked members to raise additional topics they would like considered at future meetings. The following were raised:</li> <li><i>InnerWest@40</i> Implementation</li> <li>Alan Finlay raised that there were issues with the rollout including: <ul> <li>Unclear VMS messaging that did not mention the rollout was only for local streets</li> <li>Some signages were unbagged prior to the enforcement date</li> <li>Inconsistencies between speed limit signages and on-road stencilled speed limits.</li> </ul> </li> </ul>	<ul> <li>Council officers will discuss <i>InnerWest@40</i> inconsistencies with Council's Traffic team.</li> <li>Council officers will send the presentation slide deck to members.</li> <li>Council officers have requested members to inform them of their dietary requirements to assist with future catering.</li> </ul>

<ul> <li>The chair requested a de-brief of the engagement session on the night of 26 June 2025. Alan Finlay and Angelo Arunlanandam shared the following for those who were unable to participate:</li> <li>Overall, slightly disappointing turn-up resulting in a smaller engagement than anticipated</li> <li>Parking was the most contentious topic at the engagement</li> <li>It was considered that re-zoning was not the sole answer, it is essential that a fully integrated approach be applied across the LGA and Sydney as a whole (including public and active transport improvements)</li> <li>Consideration needs to be given to mechanism to encourage and maintain affordable housing</li> <li>Supporting land uses must also be provided (eg schools and community/social infrastructure)</li> </ul>	
Members raised a question on why relatively new footpaths were being renewed rather than ones that required attention.
