6.1. Spark Youth Theatre – The Dub Project

Spark Youth Theatre (formerly Ashfield Youth Theatre) is Council's theatre program for young people aged 12 – 24 years.

The Dub Project is the latest initiative of Spark Youth Theatre and will see young and old(er) people come together to choose their favourite scenes from films and TV, learn the voices and sound FX, and then dub them live in front of an audience.
