Item 6. The Sydenham to Bankstown Urban Renewal Corridor Strategy

Recommendation:

- a) That Council continue to maintain communication with group regarding developments in this area.
- b) That Council provide an update when new information on this proposal is released by the State Government



Item 7. Working Group's Feedback on Community Strategic Plan

Consensus: EDSRG noted the information prepared by the working group.

Recommendation: That the document be submitted to Council with the following additions

a) Greater availability of creative space that council can control and influence

b) More flexibility in planning so that commercial spaces are not restricted by size or use. For example new development has a mix of retail and commercial use on street level, second level providing office accommodation and the upper levels residential.

Item 8. Disability Employment Program

Consensus: The Economic Development Strategic Reference Group note the information provide in

the presentation.

Comment: Members advised that kitchen hands are sought after all the time. It was important to

align training with interest and skills of people specifically for those with an intellectual disability. It is expected that there will be lower outcomes for people with higher needs. The program will be screened but not clinically certified. Relationships have been

established with a range of organisations to provide support.

Recommendations:

That Julia Phillips, Community Development Worker Seniors & Disability will:-

- a) Provide Economic Development Unit with details of the program and it will be circulated to business owners and advertised on Chamber web sites. (Includes a wage subsidy)
- b) Write to the Leichhardt/ Annandale Chamber
- c) Present at the next ASHBiz Chamber meeting

Item 10. Draft Food Truck Policy

Consensus: The EDSRG noted the information in the draft policy.

Comment: The Group had the following feedback on the Policy.

- Concern about the Darryl Jackson site been deemed as suitable due to closeness to Summer Hill Village and potential impact on cafes and restaurants
- At Leichhardt they may offer a cheaper meal option for families to enjoy in the park.
- Has Council considered allowing the City of Sydney food vans to operate in IWC LGA
- Businesses need to be aware well in advance when the food trucks will be introduced

Recommendation:

- a) Council have a requirement that a three month delay be applied to the commencement of the policy once adopted by council to enable existing operators to prepare for the introduction of food trucks, and
- b) Council to examine the planning process to remove the need for development consent on public land.
