

Arlington Reserve Hirer's Fact Sheet

Council requires your organisation to comply with the terms and conditions of the Operational Management Plan for Arlington Reserve. These include:

- complying with the hours of use;
- promoting compliance with traffic and car parking restrictions;
- promoting and encouraging car pooling and other forms of transport;
- an identified Community Liaison Representative;
- managing noise levels;
- ensuring the cleanliness of the reserve.

Community Liaison Representative

A Community Liaison Representative of the hirer is central to the management of the hire and manages interactions between participants and the local community. The Community Liaison Representative is required to:

be available and visible in a fluoro vest to local residents and users to discuss concerns;

- act as a conduit to Council Rangers as appropriate;
- communicate and attempt to resolve matters with local residents on an amicable basis:
- encourage users to consider local residents after use and when leaving the Oval; and
- provide a means to dispense information to visitors to the Oval.

If your hire involves more than 100 people per hour on site (including players and spectators) then there are additional requirements of the Community Liaison Representative:

- regularly visit the Reserve and surrounding streets to encourage compliance with parking restrictions;
- identify illegally parked vehicles and to attempt to locate the driver (if associated with the use of the Reserve) to get the vehicle moved;
- provide contact details of the Community Liaison (including name and contact number), in the notes section of your booking request, on your official web page and on site while the reserve is in use.

Council Rangers are aware of all bookings.

If there are any issues which cannot be resolved through the Community Liaison Representative Council's after hours service can be contacted on 9392 0000.

Getting to Arlington Reserve

The area around Arlington Reserve has limited parking opportunities, however it is well serviced by public transport facilities. All users are encouraged to use public transport to travel to the ground and advertise this to their members and spectators.

Bus - There are 4 bus routes travelling through

Dulwich Hill 425,426,428 and 445;

Light Rail - The Light Rail is immediately adjacent to Arlington Reserve;

Rail - Dulwich Hill Railway station connects with the Light Rail which is two stops from Arlington, or alternatively is a 15 minute walk (or a good warm up) from the Reserve.

These transport services are mapped over the page and you are encouraged to promote these and supply them to all participants travelling to Arlington Reserve
